3 APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING:

4 MATTERS ARISING:

ROAD REPRESENTATIVES:

Bryants Bottom Jubilee event being held at The Gate pub on Monday 4 June. New pub DM 9a owners will take over during third week of March. They have applied for a live music licence. Initial request was rejected by the council but new request for live music on Thursday thru Sunday and bank holidays between 8 and 11pm is being considered. Request also made to extend licensing hours to midnight on Fridays and Saturdays. Any objections should be made to Brian Whittall at WDC before the end of March.

9b Gypsies were seen at the entrance to 5 acres field. Police and council were advised. The fuel bowser at the entrance had been earlier removed by the farmer. It was placed back in position following the report. It was pointed out that it would be fairly simple for someone to remove it if they were determined to gain access. Everyone was reminded to be vigilant and to call Dory Morgan at the first sign of any further trouble.
